Dear Resident/business

Jockey Lane - Carriageway Reconstruction Works

Work to repair and resurface Jockey Lane between its junctions with New Lane and Kathryn Avenue will start on **Sunday 15th November 2015**. The area affected is shown on the plan on the reverse of this letter. In order to carry out this part of the work safely, a **road closure** will be necessary.

The closure on Jockey Lane will be split into two sections:

- from the New Lane mini roundabout to the East side of 'The Range' exit. This will be closed **between 7 pm and 11 pm**
- from the East side of 'The Range' exit to the West side of Kathryn Avenue. This will be closed **between 7 pm and 6 am**

It is expected that the night time road closure will be needed for approximately 7 nights. Note this is weather dependant and it may be necessary for the number of night closures to be extended.

A signed diversion route will operate for local and through traffic via New Lane and Malton Road. Bus services will be diverted for the duration of the closure and the temporary bus stops will be in use. Pedestrian access will be available at all times. Cyclists may have to dismount and use the footways when travelling through the affected areas.

Due to the nature of the works and the deep excavations taking place, it will not always be possible for residents/businesses to gain vehicular access to their properties from Jockey Lane, however pedestrian access will be maintained at all times. In these circumstances residents/businesses should be prepared to make alternative arrangements outside of the closure times shown below.

Some minor preparation works will be carried out during the day which will require traffic management, such as temporary traffic signals, this may result in some traffic disruption.

As with any construction work, there is likely to be a certain amount of disruption and inconvenience. I would like to assure you that everything reasonably possible will be done to keep this to a minimum, however, motorists should expect some delays and plan their journey accordingly. The Contractor carrying out the resurfacing work will be Tarmac Ltd who will be responsible for your safety and providing pedestrian access at all times.
